



Program Description

The Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) is currently seeking one applicant representing the development industry to serve on the Environmental Cleanup Allocation Committee (Allocation Committee) that makes recommendations to OCTA's Board of Directors on the allocation of funds for water quality improvement projects. Under Measure M2, two percent of annual gross revenues are allocated to implement street and highway related water quality improvement programs and projects that will assist Orange County cities, the County of Orange and special districts to meet federal Clean Water Act standards for urban runoff.

Committee Requirements

The Allocation Committee consists of 12 voting and two non-voting members, none of whom can be an elected official, as follows: one representing the County of Orange, five representatives of cities from each supervisorial district, one representative of Caltrans, two representatives of water or wastewater public agencies, one representative of the development industry, one representative of the scientific or academic community, one representative of a private or non-profit organization involved in environmental and water quality protection matters, one non-voting representative of the Santa Ana Regional Water Quality Control Board and one non-voting representative of the San Diego Regional Water Quality Control Board.

OCTA is looking for an individual representing the development industry with:

- Community involvement- must represent an entity in the development industry with an active membership/constituency
- A demonstrated interest and/or expertise in water quality and environmental cleanup as it pertains to infrastructure improvements and development
- Willingness to dedicate about 8 hours per year to OCTA meetings/activities

Committee Responsibilities

The Allocation Committee meets quarterly on the second Thursday of the month from 10:30 a.m. to noon. Members serve three-year terms with no term limits. The Allocation Committee is responsible for making the following recommendations to the OCTA Board of Directors:

- A competitive grant process for the allocation of environmental cleanup revenues (process shall give highest priority to capital improvement projects included in a Watershed Management Area and to cost effective projects and programs that offer opportunities to leverage other funds for maximum benefit.
- A process requiring that environmental cleanup revenues allocated for projects and programs shall supplement not supplant funding from other sources for transportation related water quality projects
- Allocation of environmental cleanup revenues for proposed projects and programs.
