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## **PROJECT OVERVIEW**

The I-5/El Toro Road Interchange Improvement Project is intended to improve traffic flow, optimize signal operations, reduce traffic congestion at local street intersections, and reduce backup at freeway on- and off-ramps. The project is in the Preliminary Engineering and Project Approval/EnvironmentalDocument (PA/ED) phase, which began in April 2017. Currently, the PA/ED phase is expected to be completed in early 2025.

Caltrans is the lead agency for the project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). OCTA is the sponsoring agency. The project is funded by OC Go (formerly known as Measure M), Orange County's Transportation Investment Plan which was renewed by nearly 70% of Orange County voters in November 2006.

### PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS

The I-5/El Toro Road Interchange Improvement Project proposes to:

- ▶ Improve traffic flow and traffic signal optimization
- ▶ Reduce traffic congestion at and through adjacent local street intersections
- ▶ Reduce back-up at freeway ramps

## **ENVIRONMENTAL STUDY PROCESS**

The purpose of the PA/ED process is to analyze the potential operational benefits and environmental effects of potential build alternatives, as well as measures to avoid, minimize and/or mitigate potential effects as feasible.

In accordance with CEQA and NEPA, it is anticipated that draft Environmental Document (DED) will be circulated for public review and comment sometime in 2024. Currently, it is anticipated During public circulation, OCTA and Caltrans will host public meeting(s) to provide an overview of the DED and to receive public comment.
